STRIVE targets the lower 1/3 of a senior class at the local high school and provides incentives in the form of scholarships and regular interaction with community leaders to motivate students to achieve higher results. Scholarships are awarded for the greatest improvement in grade point average and also for the best attendance.

To challenge, motivate and reward high school seniors who have the greatest opportunity for academic improvement!

What Is It?

For the three students that attain the highest GPA point increase during their senior year the following scholarships are to be awarded:

| 1. Top GPA improvement | \$1,000 |
| 2. 2 nd Highest improvement | \$1,000 |
| 3. 3 rd Highest improvement | \$500 |

In addition the best Strive class attendance will receive a \$500 scholarship. Any tie will be broken by considering overall school attendance.

To receive the scholarship award please have your college send a copy of your fee statement to us for reimbursement. We will send the reimbursement directly to the college. The college must be a duly accredited institution of higher learning. Your scholarship must be claimed by July 1, 2009 or be forfeited.

Anoka Ramsey Community College and Anoka Hennepin Technical College foundations have agreed to match these awards should you attend either institution.

At the end of the year, all applicants will have the 11th grade cumulative GPA subtracted from the cumulative GPA through the senior year. The individual with the greatest improvement will be the winner.

Are There Only Four Winners?

No, everybody who improves their GPA is really a winner, but the Blaine /Ham Lake Rotary Club is prepared to reward four students who make significant improvements.

How Do I Apply?

You must fill out a form available in the Counseling Office. All students who fill out the form will participate in meetings. Students can begin to participate immediately.
